## Key Events and Experiences

### Year

#### 11

Students are afforded several opportunities to explore post-16 choices including further study and apprenticeship opportunities.

- Relevant courses and open days are signposted for students who leave at 16.
- Directed tutor sessions when tutors revisit Planning your Future booklet with individual students.

### Year

#### 10

They are also introduced to 'HOP' which has relevant and up-to-date information on careers in Hertfordshire and the current priorities of local employers. This enables students to research their own career pathway and to stay informed of current developments and opportunities.

- Students and parents are provided with online 16+ booklet 'planning for your future'
- Information evening for Year 10 parents and students with post 16 options explained.

### Year

#### 9

Our 'Living in the Wider World' unit within PSHE enables students to explore their skill set and their strengths.

- The importance of time-management
- Innovation and Creative thinking
- Building the perfect team.

### Year

#### 8

Within the Personal Development programme, students explore human rights, workplace rights, and rights and responsibilities within our communities.

### Year

#### 7

Students explore Careers within their PSHE lessons.
