

students

Option Subject
Students choose 4

Most students will complete 10 GCSEs... 6 Core and 4 Options...

- Tiered entry (higher or foundation)

Science

- Double science (2 GCSE), tiered
- Students can opt for separate sciences

- Full course GCSE started in Y9

A Typical Timetable

At St. George's, we have 24 lessons (+ Friday 5) per week.

You need to consider...

- Greater choice brings a greater responsibility to create your own BALANCED curriculum.
- 2. Begin to think about your future.
- 3. Different subjects offer... different skills... different activities... different learning styles.

Things you SHOULD do...

Try to achieve breadth and balance by choosing a range of subjects.

Consider if meeting the EBacc criteria is right for you. (this would mean choosing a language and either History or Geography).

Think about which subjects you enjoy!

...and subjects you are good at!

Think about the demands of the course e.g. NEA (non-examined assessment vs exams).

What will you timetable look like? Will you have a creative outlet?

Read the booklet carefully... make sure you know what you may be studying.

Things you SHOULD do...

Ask for information and advice...

From subject staff

From your tutor

From older students

Look back at your Year 9 Progress review on Edulink.

Think about life after Y11... will you need specific subjects?

Consider where you are starting from - this is a especially relevant with languages!

Things you SHOULD NOT do...

Choose subjects just because of your friends...

Or because of your favourite teacher.

Or because of your parents.

Think that you are deciding your whole future over the next few weeks.

Choose Business AND Economics within your 4.

Discuss options on social media.

Get fooled into thinking there are 'easy options'.

Advice for Parents

- Use the parents evening wisely (Booking opens 8pm tomorrow)
- Guide, listen and ask questions
- Give <u>freedom</u> to choose
- Get <u>advice</u>
 (from Teacher, Tutor, House team)



Advice for Parents

- It is perfectly <u>normal to know exactly</u> what they want to study
- It is perfectly <u>normal to know some</u> of what they want to study
- It is perfectly <u>normal to have no idea</u> what they want to study in the future so find this very difficult












