Exam Arrangements for Consortium Students

National A' Level/BTEC examinations

Students studying a subject at a Consortium School will usually be entered for the exams in the subject in question at that school, they will also sit all the relevant papers there. The only exception to this is when a subject includes no NEA content (Non-Examination Assessment), in which case the entry may be made at the Home School and exam papers sat there. This will be confirmed by the exams team.

When entries have been made to sit exams at the Consortium School, it is the student's responsibility to check that they have received a statement of entry and/or a personal exam timetable showing the correct entries. Students also need to ascertain the Consortium School's policies for exams e.g. arrangements for confirming ID, rules regarding electronic devices in the exam venue etc. The students should also confirm details of any orals or practicals not shown on timetables, either with the Consortium School's subject teacher or Exams Officer.

Examination certificates will be available from the student's Home School when they are issued.

Students will sit internal examinations for the consortium subject at the Consortium School, which are often organised at different times of the year. Students are responsible for knowing when they are taking place, and should also ensure that they have excused themselves from any lessons that they may miss at their Home School as a result.
