



# HOME-SCHOOL AGREEMENT POLICY

*This version applies to **day pupils** in Years 7 to 11*

## **The Parents shall:**

- see that their child goes to School regularly, on time, wearing the correct uniform and properly equipped throughout the school year;
- take responsibility for their child's journey to and from school at the appropriate times;
- support the Christian Foundation of the School including the requirement for their child to attend Sunday Chapel as indicated in the termly calendar;
- let the School know about any concerns or problems that might affect their child's work or behaviour;
- support the School's Discipline Policy and work with staff to ensure a supportive ethos is maintained;
- support their child in homework and other opportunities for home learning;
- when possible, attend Parents' Evenings and discussions about their child's progress.

## **The School will:**

- provide challenging educational experiences, in a safe, caring and orderly environment, which encourage pupils to realise their full potential;
- contact Parents if there is a problem with attendance, Chapel attendance, punctuality, behaviour or equipment;
- let Parents know about any concerns or problems that affect their child's work or behaviour;
- monitor the pupil's effort through half-termly tutor cards and provide an annual report on the pupil's progress;
- set and monitor homework in accordance with the School's homework policy;
- arrange Parents' Evenings during which the pupil's progress will be discussed;
- keep Parents informed about School activities through a termly calendar, the school website, termly newsletter and notices about special events;
- provide opportunities for Parents to contribute to the life of the School and welcome their presence in Sunday Chapel.

## **The Pupil shall:**

- attend school and Chapel regularly and on time;
- be polite and helpful to others;
- help to make the school an orderly and caring place;
- do all his/her work, including homework, as well as he/she can;
- bring all the equipment he/she needs every day;

- wear the school uniform or sixth form dress code as appropriate and be tidy in appearance;
- comply with the school's anti-bullying and discipline policies;
- support and become involved in School and House events;
- keep the school free from litter and graffiti.
